Retreat Course – With a masterful renovation in 2001 by Davis Love III and his brother, Mark, to appeal to a broad range of golfers, the Retreat Course is challenging, yet very playable and interesting. An additional 300 yards of length and wider fairways give Retreat an open feeling with a lower profile. Defined by Georgia pines, native oaks and bunkers, the course still allows players to swing freely for the target. The course has several unusually shaped holes with dog legs left and right, and large greens with tricky slopes and undulation, resulting in a fun, shot-making course.







Kayaking with Shore Lunch – Paddle through Sea Island's marsh area and tidal grasslands on a private guided tour with the residential Naturalist. Waterproof footwear required.

Cost: \$190, including tour, transportation and box lunch.

Sea Island Tour – Enjoy a four-hour tour that focuses on the history of St. Simon's

Island, beginning with a ride down Sea Island Drive, considered one of the most beautiful thoroughfares in America. The tour starts with lunch at a local restaurant and visits historical landmarks including Fort Frederica National Park, Wesley Memorial Garden, Christ Church, Retreat Plantation and the Museum of Coastal History and Lighthouse.

Cost: \$200 per person includes lunch, tour and transportation.

Sea Island Shooting School – The art of clay target shooting is a treasured tradition since 1929 at Sea Island, and the Sea Island Shooting School ranks among the nation's best. As one of the oldest standing original buildings on Sea Island, the Shooting School was one of the first Skeet Clubs in the country. Today, the School offers skeet, trap and sporting clays for experienced and novice shooters. Safety instruction and shells included.



Cost: \$190 per person includes transportation. Lunch on your own at hotel before departure.



Jekyll Island Tour – From 1886 until 1942, Jekyll Island was owned by some of the country's wealthiest men who established a hunting club to enjoy the island's mild winter climate with hunting and other amusements for family and friends. Among those belonging to the club were the Astors, the Goulds, the Rockefellers, the Morgans and the Vanderbilts. In 1904, the club was described as "by far the most exclusive club that ever existed." The five-hour island tour includes the historic district, the interiors of two cottages, Faith Chapel with the exquisite Tiffany window and lunch at a local restaurant. Cost: \$250 per person includes lunch, tour and transportation.
