Kentucky and Ohio. His role later expanded to managing the company's two retails stores in Ohio and Michigan, before moving back to the factory in Conover, N.C. His direction of merchandising and strategic planning led to a tripling of sales and creating the "Make it Yours Bedroom" program that positioned Vanguard as a prime resource for custom furniture. He also introduced 3D visualization of consumer-generated design with instantaneous price quotes as options are revised.

The son of a diplomat, Charles spent his formative years in Yugoslavia, Greece and Korea. He graduated from Mary Washington University in Virginia and later took graduate-level courses in the Futures Study program at the University of Houston.

After college Mr. Kennedy rode to Los Angeles on his motorcycle and spent a year couch-surfing as he attempted to break into the entertainment business. After a decade with Fox Broadcasting, Charles spent seven years with the premiere social trends company DYG. There he worked with corporate leaders across major brands to leverage consumer insights, including projects with AHFA. That role took him back to TV where he led research and strategy

teams at ABC, NBCUniversal, The Advertising Research Foundation, Amazon Prime Video and Apple TV+.

An avid road biker and mediocre surfer, Charles works and writes in Los Angeles while taking classes in everything from astronomy to strength-training.

Paula Wallace, president and co-founder,
Savannah College of Art and Design, with

Paula Wallace founded SCAD in 1978, and is one of the longest-serving women presidents in the history of U.S. higher education. Since being named CEO in 2000, she has more than tripled enrollment, elevated the SCAD alumni



employment rate to 99%, and led the creation of new SCAD locations in the U.S. (SCAD Atlanta) and Europe (SCAD Lacoste), as well as SCADnow, the university's innovative online learning platform. As the world's most comprehensive university for creative professions, SCAD currently enrolls more than 18,600 students.

Wallace established SCAD as a global leader of applied research through SCADpro, the university's inhouse research lab, where SCAD students and professors produce new products and services for clients including Google, Deloitte, Home Depot, Volvo, BMW, NASA, Capital One and hundreds of other Fortune 500 brands. Wallace has led the creation and establishment of four university museums on two continents, including SCAD FASH Museum of Fashion + Film (Atlanta), SCAD FASH Lacoste (France), and the AIA Award-winning SCAD Museum of Art (Savannah), widely recognized as the top teaching museum in the world.

Wallace's impact on the creative industries is vast. Across her more than 45 years at SCAD, she has led the creation of more than 100 academic degree programs—many the first of their kind—including, most recently, the M.A. and M.F.A. in sneaker design, the new Master of Business Innovation (M.B.I.), and two degrees launched in collaboration with Google: a B.F.A. in user experience design and a B.F.A. in user experience research. She has conceived and created the SCAD Savannah Film Festival (the world's largest university-run film festival), SCAD

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TVfest, SCAD AnimationFest, SCAD deFINE ART, and the legendary SCAD Fashion Show, among other signature showcase events at the university, all of which are designed to launch the careers of SCAD students.



Eric Hunicutt is an executive coach, workshop facilitator, learning designer, content creator, consultant, performer and educator with over two decades experience guiding individuals and teams, leading creative projects and educational initiatives, and mentoring and

coaching clients as they share the stories of their work and their professional journey with the world.

He is a graduate of The University of North Carolina and attended the Alan Alda Center for Communicating Science at Stoney Brook University.

Beyond her work in the classroom, Edwards has consulted on design projects throughout Savannah and shared her expertise through contributions to Furniture Today, Apartment Therapy, and Livingetc.





Jesús Rojas is an innovation strategist, creative executive and design leader serving as Vice President for SCADpro and Innovation at the Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD). In this role, he leads the university's globally recognized innovation studio, connecting SCAD's top-tier student and faculty talent with Fortune 100 partners to solve real-world challenges through bold, design-driven solutions. Jesús arrived at the university as an international student, earning his Master of Arts in product design after completing undergraduate studies in Venezuela.
